## **Course Overview**

Confined spaces are indeed deadly places. Every year workers die needlessly in confined spaces. Recognition of the hazard is a big part of the problem. Poor project planning and ignorance regarding the tools that are available to help are a big issue too.

In the last few years we have seen significant change in the drivers for health and safety compliance in Alberta. New changes to the Alberta Occupational Health and Safety Act, Regulation and Code, specifically ***Part 5 Confined Spaces*** details the legislative requirements here in Alberta. While we all recognize the importance of implementing strong policy and procedure and engineering controls it is not enough to control the hazards associated with confined spaces. To meet compliance we need a ***Code of Practice for Confined Space Entry***. This Code governs the practices and procedures to be followed when workers enter and work in a confined space.

The course will be facilitated by health and safety industry experts. The hands-on demonstrations will be led by the product technical specialists from Sperian Protection.

In this course participants will be provided an overview of the current regulatory framework related to confined space entry. The course format will include a short PowerPoint presentation followed by a demonstration of the range of equipment available to assist.
